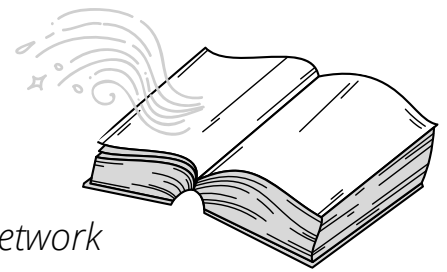


Tips for Studying the Bible

Use a Study Bible

- Read the intro to the book of the Bible you're reading
- Look at the outline of the book to get the rough idea of the flow
- Read the notes on the bottom/side of your passage for additional information

Look for the big picture

- Get the general feel and flow of the book you're studying
- Read through the whole book of the Bible at a brisk pace
- Write out a short outline of the main points

Read your passage closely

- Are there examples of repetition?
- Are there promises or commands?
- Does it say anything about God's character?
- Are there people, places, customs, nations, etc. that could use additional research?

Use a Bible Dictionary

- Nouns: people, places, customs, etc. (ex. Donkey)
- The book of the Bible you're studying
- The author of the book of the Bible
- The audience the book was originally intended for (ex. Corinth)

Use a Commentary (optional)

Re-read the chapter before and after

Write a one sentence summary
