



SASKATOON: An outreach initiative exploring **“A First Nations Understanding of What Jesus Did”** allows for connection and ministry with indigenous students.

TORONTO: “Relevant Series,” a week of outreach is attended by over 1300 and expands to additional campuses. **Many attendees express interest in further conversation.**

MONTREAL: **An interfaith dialogue draws over 100 students** as they discuss what faith brings to Quebec society.

CALGARY: 700 students attend events discussing **“Does God Exist?”** and **“Does God Matter?”**

WINNIPEG: **“Story of the Soul - I Crave Meaning”**, a coffeehouse experience, ministers to 59 people who come to discuss life and meaning.

TORONTO: **1500 people watch a fascinating dialogue on the meaning of life** featuring Dr. William Lane Craig, Dr. Jordan Peterson, and Dr. Rebecca Newberger Goldstein. Co-sponsored by P2C–Students, the dialogue is simulcast to 60 additional locations and viewed over 500,000 times in the month following.

QUEBEC CITY: Visual story “The Masterpiece” presented by chalk artist François Bergeron allows **50 students to experience a story themed about Jesus.** Spiritual discussions follow.

VANCOUVER: P2C campus communities **partner with other student ministries to host Alpha.**

GUELPH: Students experiment with a new idea they call “Deep Chats Cafe”, a casual discussion time on deeper things. **Non-Christian students request three subsequent discussion times.**

HALIFAX: An event addressing the question **“Is anything worth believing?”** is simulcast online.
